4 Dimensions of Reality = 4 Quadrants

- ❖ All human languages contain the words for indicating: the “I”, “We” and “It” and “collectives of its”
- ❖ The 4 quadrants show the universal recognition of Subject and Object as well as the Individual and Collective aspects of experience
- ❖ These aspects can be graphed in a way that is useful for identifying the major dimensions of any given human situation or topic of inquiry
- ❖ They can also be used to diagnose and systematically address conflict and issues from multiple perspectives

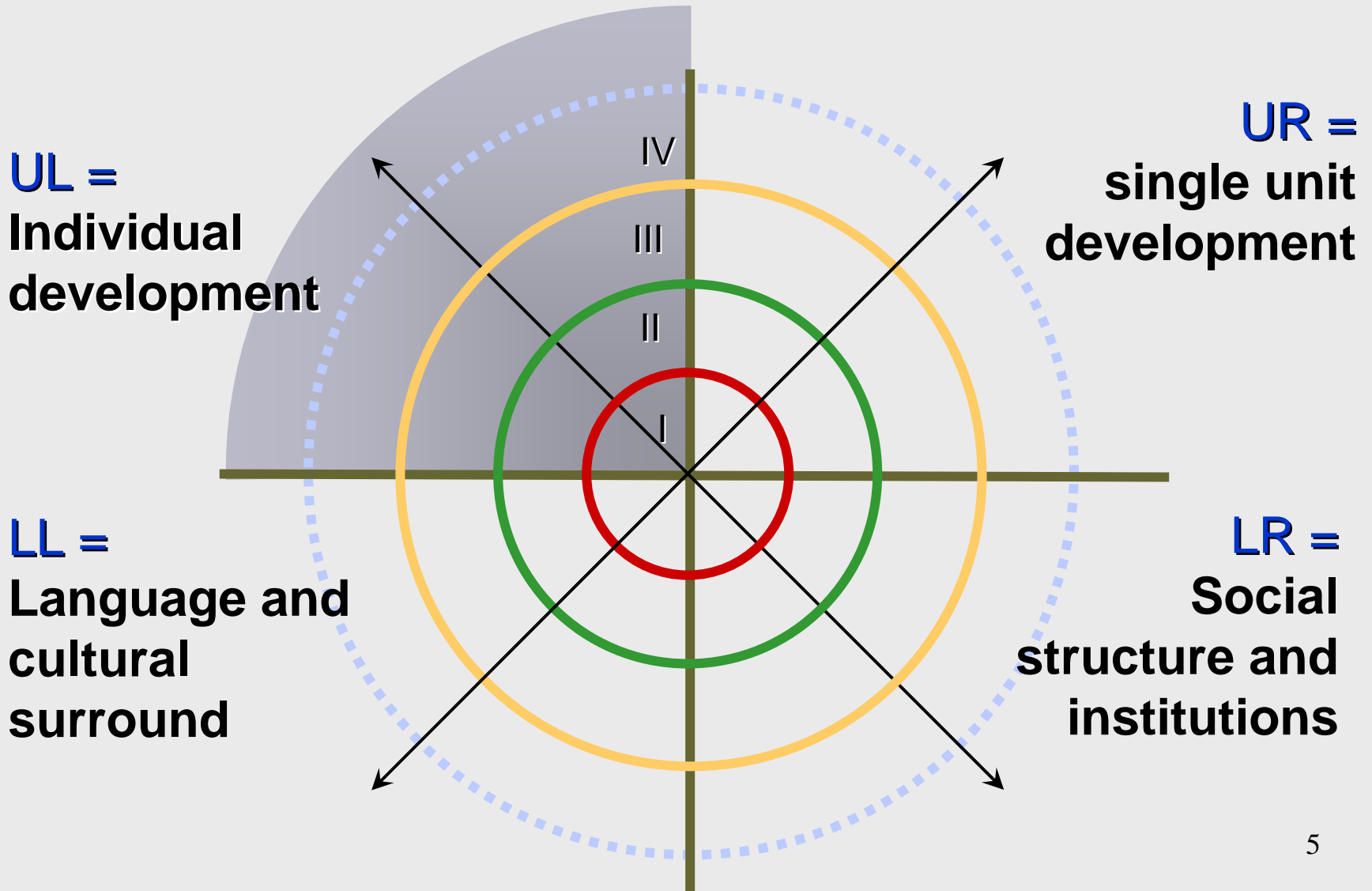
The Upper Left Quadrant or Interior Development

The development of the Self or Ego as described in Ego Development theory and its organizational application as the Leadership Maturity Framework focuses on the Upper Left quadrant.

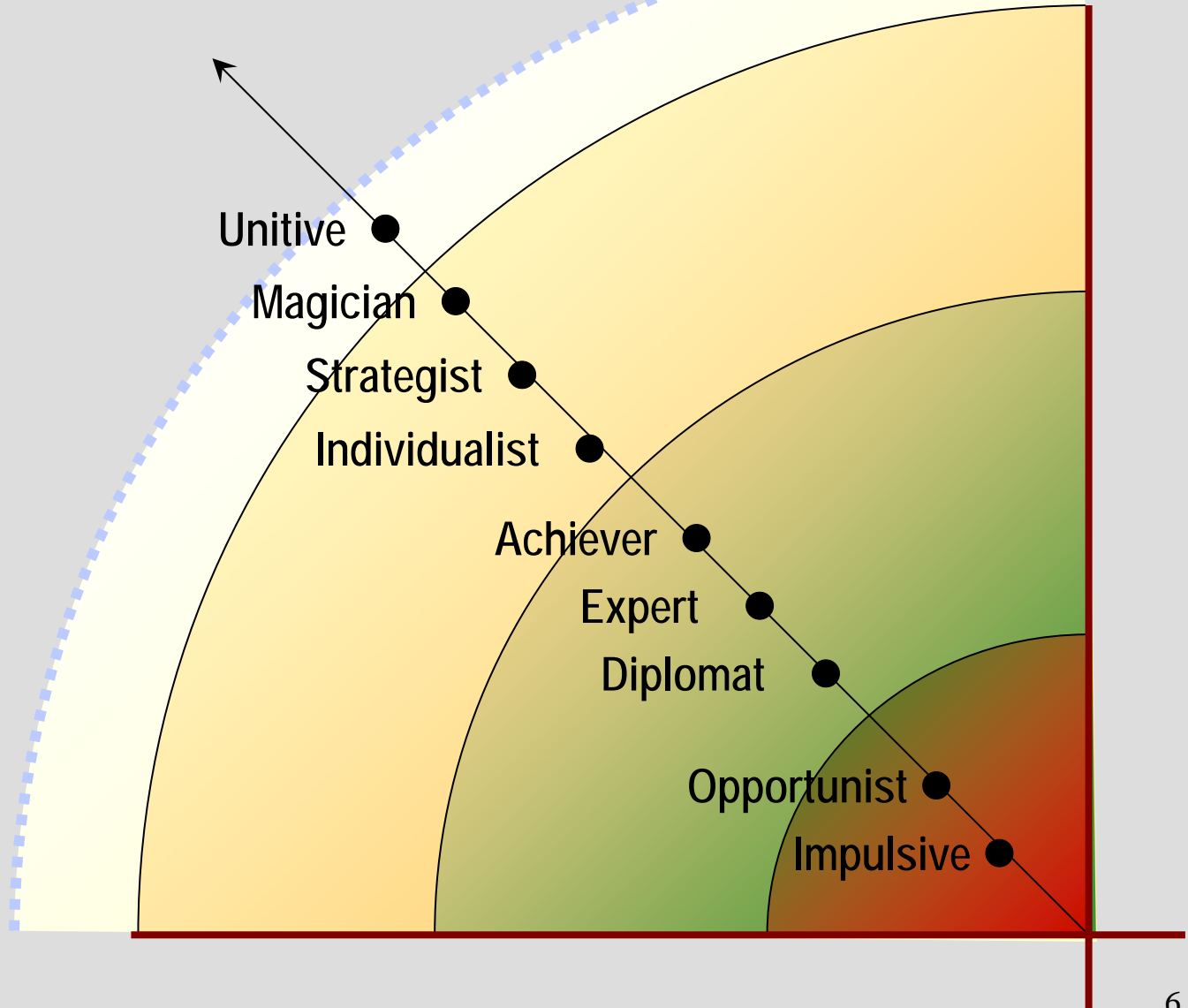
It is in the UL where levels of development are identified. As described in Cook-Greuter's research and that of others (Kegan, Wilber) adults show distinct patterns of increasing complexity and integration in what they can experience and pay attention to.

Developmental Aspect of the Individual Interior



In an Integral Framework, each quadrant is always influenced by all others.

When we look the development of self-awareness for instance, the other three quadrants are part of the reason the self experiences what it does in the specific way it does because it is inextricably interrelated with

(UR) a bio-physio-chemical body, governed by the laws of physics, and the biosphere

(LL) cultural/historical context and shared meanings

(LR) the social arrangements, laws etc., that structure and define society
